Addressing a need to increase math and reading achievement scores drives Walkerville Public School's improvement plans; however, a District Improvement Team identified a strong need to address behavior and motivation support prior to adding increased math and reading support. The summer of 2016 and the fall of 2016 will be focused on establishing a positive school climate by working with all staff and student stakeholders. Increased reading support work will begin in the winter of 2017.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. **PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL**—There is only one school within the district, so all students over the last two years have been assigned to the K-12 building.
